LEARNING AT BHN

STUDENT WORK







KR students are great scientists and have been learning about living things. KR have been investigating living things and their life cycles. We have focused on the life cycle of a chicken, and are currently observing the life cycle of plants. We have planted seeds in small pots, and are currently recording the cycle of a plants growth.



During literacy sessions 1H have been writing persuasive texts. One of these has been a letter to their parents to persuade them to purchase them either a toy or a pet they would like to have. I wonder how many of our 1H parents were persuaded?





As part of our reading, 3/4W has been learning about refugees. In our computer lesson, we further researched using the topic statement "It is hard to be a refugee". We discovered some possible difficulties refugees face and students also interviewed family members that had experienced such challenges. In small groups, the students then identified some of the key areas that refugees would find difficult.

5/6B have been writing information texts with a focus on different audience needs. We wrote an information text about our class pets, spiny leaf insects, for k-2 students, 3-6 students and adults.







5/6R have been learning about circle and triangles and their properties during maths lessons. We measured, drew and calculated numerous angles using protractors. We also used compasses to draw various sized circles. As a creative maths activity we used what we had learnt about circles and triangles to design our own patterns. We are very proud of our final pieces of maths art!

OZHARVEST'S FEAST PROGRAM

OzHarvest's new FEAST program will inspire kids to eat healthy, waste less and be change-makers in the local community.

OzHarvest is Australia's leading food rescue organisation with a driving purpose to *Nourish Our Country*.

With a vision to build a world with zero food waste and free of hunger, creating awareness and influencing behavioural change through community education opportunities are central to achieving this.

OzHarvest's new education program FEAST (Food Education and Sustainability Training) is designed to teach and inspire kids in years 5 and 6 about sustainability, food waste and nutrition. FEAST is full of fun, interactive activities for students as they explore the role food plays in everyday lives and the importance of protecting the planet. It extends beyond the classroom, as students develop the skills to become change makers in the community.

The program is presented within a beautiful classroom inquiry based unit, focused on detailed lesson planning tools and recipes that align with Australian Curriculum Links and Cross Curriculum Priority: Sustainability. FEAST recipes can be made in class and do not require a kitchen, making the cooking and food education components accessible to all children and school communities.
