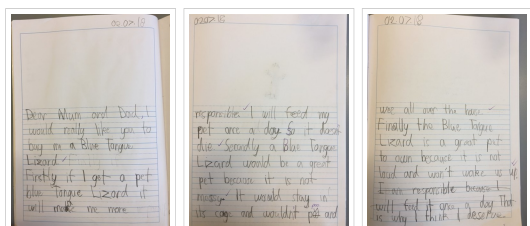
LEARNING AT BHN

STUDENT WORK

KY has been learning to add two groups of numbers and record the answer. The students enjoyed using domino patterns to help them practise their adding skills.
