## Principal's Message

#### Welcome Back to Term 2

It was lovely to see all our students back with smiles on their faces ready for a term filled with learning and fun experiences.

#### Works Around the School

During the holidays, the playground space behind the hall and outside the library had new asphalt laid, and synthetic turf installed around the sandpit. It looks wonderful. If you have not already done so, take a walk down there to appreciate how lovely it looks. Once the new asphalt has settled, we will add new playground markings for the students to enjoy. The sandpit will be upgraded and open soon for the students to use. The covered walkway from 5/6B classroom to room 20 has had new awnings installed, and the new roofing on 5/B, 2D, 2N and 1/2T is being installed and looking amazing.

Mr Sheen and Mr Peters have been working on the gardens planting new plants and grasses. They have started to replace the rotting logs in the garden beds outside the kindergarten rooms with new sleepers.

## Staffing News

#### Clubs

BHN clubs will be starting this term.

A note was sent home week 1 outlining the clubs that will be running, and the day they will be on. Clubs are groups that teachers volunteer to run to give students the opportunity to try something new, be part of a small group activity, pursue a hobby and make new connections.

Clubs will run on a weekly or fortnightly basis during lunch time for approx. 30 minutes. Teachers give up their own lunch time to run these clubs, so there cannot be a guarantee that the club will run consistently, as teachers' schedules may change.

Each Club will have a maximum number of students able to attend. If your child misses out participating in a club during Term 2 due to club capacity, they will have the opportunity to join the club Term 3.

New clubs have been added to the original list. This includes years 5-6 dance, drama and Storychasers. Days, times and teachers of these new clubs will be communicated when finalised.

#### Parent Workshops

We will be running a series of workshops and information sessions for parents throughout the year. These sessions will focus on building parent's capacity to support learning at home and accessing support and resources that are available in the community. We value working in partnership with parents to support our student's academic achievement and wellbeing.

#### Multicultural Dinner

Our community cultural dinner held at the end of last term was a huge success. It was wonderful to see so many families come and enjoy a meal together, making new connections and building upon our BHN community spirit. Thank you to all the businesses who supported the initiative, donating food and supplies. We look forward to this becoming an annual event.

#### Student Attendance

Consistent attendance at school improves student outcomes, increases career options, and helps students build relationships and confidence. Missing a day here or there may not seem like much, but absences add up and can impact your child's learning more than you think. When your child misses one day a week over a year, that's 40 days of school, 8 weeks of lessons and 2.5 years over their school life lost. Students are expected to have above a 95% school attendance rate, because days missed is years lost. That's why making sure your child comes to school every single day (unless genuinely sick) is so important. Please remember, holidays should only be booked during school breaks. Students should be at school every day during school term, right from the first day until the last.

If your child misses' school due to illness, religious reasons, family circumstances, or other reasons, remember to contact the office on 97593849, send an email or use the BHNPS Student Absentee tile on the SZApp to explain the absence.

If your child arrives at school late or needs to leave early, you will need to go to the school office to sign your child in or out and explain the reason for the absence.

If you're having difficulty getting your child to school and on time everyday, contact the school for support.

KK have been learning about 2D shapes during their maths lessons this term. We have learned about the different attributes of shapes and how to sort them. Children had an opportunity to sort different shapes in the classroom and then went outside to practise drawing triangles using chalk. We have been engaging in maths all around our school this year to show that maths is all around us.

2D have been busy mathematicians!! We have been looking at how a collection of the same quantity can be arranged in different ways. Through the use of concrete materials students have demonstrated their understanding that numbers can be partitioned in different ways and no matter how a collection is arranged the quantity remains the same. Students were able to orgaise a collection of objects in different ways, describe the collection, work within a group to solve the problem and explain why the quantity remains the same even when objects are arranged differently.





#### 3/4F

3/4F have been looking at the significance of ANZAC day as a time to pay respect to the brave soldiers who fought for their country, discussing values such as mateship and courage. Students enjoyed creating an artwork to remember the fallen soldiers in battle.
